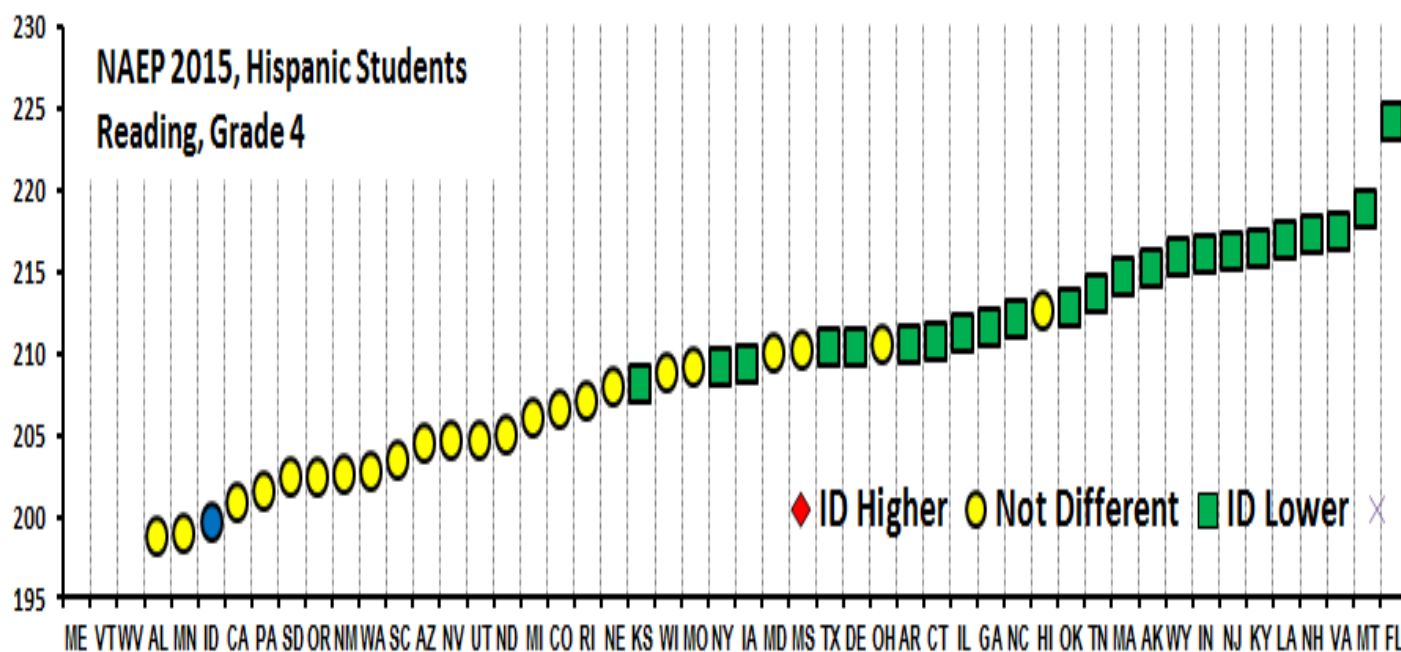




Idaho Average Score vs. the Other States—Hispanic Students NAEP 2015 Reading, Grade 4

The National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) reading assessment used multiple-choice and constructed-response items to examine student knowledge and skills using grade-appropriate literary and informational texts. Scores range from zero (0) to 500, where 208 is *Basic* (meets grade-level expectations), 238 is *Proficient* (higher than grade level performance), and 268 is *Advanced*. NAEP does not sample students enrolled in virtual charter schools.



NAEP 2015 Reading Assessment, Grade 4:

- Idaho’s Hispanic fourth graders had a NAEP 2015 average reading score that was *higher* than their peers in none of the other states.
- Idaho’s Hispanic fourth graders had a NAEP 2015 average reading score that was *not significantly different* from their peers in twenty-three (23) states: AL, AZ, CA, CO, HI, MD, MI, MN, MO, MS, ND, NE, NM, NV, OH, OR, PA, RI, SC, SD, UT, WA, and WI.
- Idaho’s Hispanic fourth graders had a NAEP 2015 average reading score that was *lower* than their peers in twenty-three (23) states: AK, AR, CT, DE, FL, GA, IA, IL, IN, KS, KY, LA, MA, MT, NC, NH, NJ, NY, OK, TN, TX, VA, and WY.
- Idaho’s Hispanic fourth graders in 2015 scored lower in reading knowledge and skills than their Hispanic peers in public schools across the nation.
- Three (3) states did not meet NAEP reporting requirements: ME, VT, and WV.
